

Highlights for 2001

- A juvenile Intake Officer position was created to enhance the efficiency of the juvenile intake process. The officer will receive and review allegations of delinquency for the purpose of considering the commencement of proceedings under 42 Pa C.S. Sec. 6301 et seq., The Juvenile Act. The officer will process the allegations for informal or formal action before the Court, ensuring that there is balanced attention given to competency development, accountability and protection for the community.
- A juvenile Community Based Officer was added to the Court Supervision compliment, with the assistance of Juvenile Court Judges' Commission specialized funding, to monitor youth assigned to community based dispositions. This officer will network with social service agencies, schools, law enforcement and other resources in the community to ensure that balanced attention is achieved.
- Software developed for adult probation departments in the Commonwealth was acquired and installed to assist the adult division with case management functions, offender tracking and various administrative tasks
- The PA DUI Association's Safety Bug was made available to area high schools for an afternoon through funding obtained from the Northwest Regional Highway Safety Network.
- A 2001 Chevy Malibu was purchased via JCJC funding as a resource for juvenile staff for training and field work.
- Court Supervision hosted the PA DUI Association's Region IV business meeting and training at the Inn at Franklin. This training was open to area law enforcement and treatment staff and included a segment on Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) as well as a presentation on alcohol and the effects on the body. Attendees were also given an opportunity to participate in a computer simulated driving experience, which replicated the dangers of driving under the influence.
- Court Supervision joined the Stand Tall Program and their efforts to promote drug free activities for youth, by accepting an invitation for the school based probation officer to serve on the committee at Cranberry High School
- Efforts to provide sex offenders with therapy at the local level culminated in the creation of a weekly group facilitated by therapists from Project Point of Light based in Clarion and Dubois.
- Computer hardware upgrades for the juvenile division were made possible in 2001 with a \$22,000 grant from the Juvenile Court Judges Commission.

Clients Per Month for 2 Intensive Juvenile Probation Officers




Clients per Month for School-Based Juvenile Officer








