

Local Domestic Relations Rules – Venango County

Rule 1930.4. Service of Original Process in Domestic Relations Matters

- (a) All counsel should take notice of the note following Pa.R.C.P. 1930.4: Service of Original Process in Domestic Relations Matters, which states that service upon an incarcerated person in a domestic relations action must also include notice of any hearing in such action, and specific notice of the incarcerated individual's right to apply to the Court for a writ of habeas corpus ad testificandum to enable him or her to participate in the hearing.
- (b) The notice shall be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE TO INCARCERATED PARTIES

Plaintiff and Defendant are directed to appear on the _____ day of _____, 20__ at _____ m. in Courtroom _____ Venango County Courthouse, Franklin, Pennsylvania for a hearing. If you are incarcerated, you are also hereby notified of your right to apply to the Court for a Writ of Habeas Corpus ad Testificandum enabling you to participate in the hearing. Any party who desires that an incarcerated individual testify at the hearing in

this matter also has a right to apply to the Court for a writ of habeas corpus ad testificandum to enable the incarcerated person to testify.
