




Level of ARD Supervision as of December 31, 2012



**Referrals by Month**












Status of Offender to House Arrest (Total Supervised)





## Total New Clients Referred to House Arrest












**VENANGO COUNTY




*Location of Juvenile Clients on House Arrest-New Clients*










