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A Message from the Director

I am pleased to provide you with our 2014 Annual Report. On behalf of the entire department thank you for taking the time to review this information.

Court Supervision is a combined juvenile probation and adult intermediate punishment department committed to providing a balanced approach to the administration of justice. Our programs and supervision strategies are designed to protect the community, hold the offender accountable, restore the victim and address offender competencies. We believe that it is imperative to employ evidence-based practices at every stage of the justice process; to collect and analyze the data necessary to measure the results of these efforts; and to strive to continuously improve the quality of our decisions, services and programs. Thank you to the committed and professional staff of Court Supervision who are responsible for the positive outcomes reported herein. Thanks also to our community partners, sister county agencies and other stakeholders for supporting our mission.

2014 was highlighted with several department projects. One major undertaking was the addition of the juvenile delinquency module to the Court of Common Pleas Case Management System. All juvenile allegation information will now be entered and maintained by our juvenile division. Ultimately, this system will interface with our Juvenile Case Management System thereby eliminating duplication and increasing efficiency and accuracy. Another important initiative involved all field staff becoming certified in the Protective Safety Systems model of defensive tactics, principles of control and handcuffing. Lastly, Court Supervision hosted a week long facilitator certification training to deliver Cognitive Behavior Change Curricula presented by the National Curriculum and Training Institute. This training was attended by representatives from eight PA counties, two PA State Agencies, three surrounding States and one Federal agency.



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Accelerated Rehabilitative Disposition Program







2008-2014**





Substance Impaired Driver Safety Program











