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A Message from the Director

I am pleased to provide you with our 2015 Annual Report. On behalf of the entire department thank you for taking the time to review this information and I hope you find it to be of some value.

There with several department projects and events in 2015 worthy of comment including the following:

- One major undertaking was the conversion from Digital Solutions Inc.'s adult probation management system to the County Commissioner's Association of PA's, Unified Case Management System for our adult probation cases. The long term objective of this project is to have multiple departments using this system thereby eliminating the duplication associated with data entry.
- Court Supervision also hosted a Regional Motivational Interviewing (MI) Forum for MI coaches and supervisors. Counties in attendance included Allegheny, Armstrong, Butler, Crawford, McKean, Mercer, Venango, Warren, and Washington.
- Venango County became one of six additional PA counties to participate in the Standardized Program Evaluation Protocol (SPEP) rollout process. Working in collaboration with our providers and the Penn State EPIS Center, the juvenile division will review the risk level and needs of our youth and the quality, dosage and duration of programming offered by the providers in an effort to improve outcomes and reduce recidivism among our juvenile population.
- Court Supervision Officers received training in the use of, and were equipped with Naloxone in 2015. Naloxone (Narcan) is a medication that can reverse an overdose that is caused by an opioid drug (i.e. prescription pain medication or heroin). The Department was also involved in various community forums sponsored by the Overdose Drug Task Force.

Thank you to the committed and professional staff of Court Supervision who are responsible for the positive outcomes reported herein. Thanks also to our community partners, sister county agencies and other stakeholders for supporting our mission.

Finally, I would like to thank President Judge Oliver J. Lobaugh and District Court Administrator Lynn Cummings-Wilson for their ongoing support and Alisa Brown, Administrative Assistant, for her work on this report.


MISSION STATEMENT





TOTAL OFFENDERS SERVING SENTENCES ON ALCOHOL MONITORING IN 2015: 37





Substance Impaired Driver Safety Program








Location of Juvenile Clients on House Arrest-New Clients




